SPSS Laptops

Exciting news! Faculty can now borrow laptops equipped with SPSS for use in their classes.

A total of 58 laptops are available - 18 are housed in the Library, and the remainder can be borrowed from IT. To ensure availability for your class, please email library@unfc.ca with your class time and the quantity needed.

If your students would like to practice using SPSS outside of the classroom, the software has also been installed on the Library's desktop computers and other laptops - students are free to use these at any time!

Saved Resources and Saved Searches

Did you know you can save your research in the Library's catalogue? You can save both individual resources and your full search results, including your search string and any filters you may have used. All saved resources and searches will appear under the "Saved" tab on the left side navigation bar.

OPEN ACCESS CORNER:

Creative Commons Licenses

Many open access resources are published under a Creative Commons license. These types of licenses allow works to be distributed and adapted according to limitations set by the creator. There are four limitations:

- Attribution (BY): The work can be shared, but the original author must be cited
- Share Alike (SA): The work can be adapted and reproduced, on the condition the same license type is used
- Non-commercial (NC): the work cannot be used for commercial purposes
- No Derivatives (ND): Remixes or derivatives of the work cannot be shared



Some limitations can be combined – for example, a creator may license their work as BY-SA-NC, meaning attribution must be given, the work can be adapted, but it cannot be used for commercial purposes.
